

Christ is central to Christian belief. He is the Son of God who came to the world to teach about love, forgiveness, and salvation. The cross is the symbol of Christianity, with Jesus Christ's crucifixion and resurrection serving as the pivotal events. The term "INRI" is often inscribed on depictions of the cross, but what does it stand for and why is it significant?

Pontius Pilate

In addition to the biblical writings there are other records that show that Pilate was the Roman Governor of Judea between 27 and 36 AD and possibly beyond. As Governor, Pilate held the authority to sentence individuals to death. The Gospels portray him as a conflicted figure who, despite personal misgivings about Jesus's guilt, ultimately succumbed to the pressure of the crowd demanding Jesus's crucifixion. Pilate's involvement adds a layer of political tension to the event which hints at the complexities of Roman rule over the Jewish people.

The inscription "INRI" on the cross was decreed by Pilate and he ordered it to be placed above Jesus's head during the crucifixion. According to John it was written in three languages (Hebrew, Latin and Greek) and it stands for "lesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum" ("Jesus the Nazarene, King of the Jews").

Symbolism

But what was in Pilate's mind when he ordered that inscription?

The usual view is one of cruel irony. Pilate's inscription was intended to mock Jesus and his own people that had handed Him over to be crucified. By calling Jesus the "King of the Jews," Pilate might have highlighted the tension between Roman authority and, as it would have seemed to him, the futile Jewish expectations of a Messiah.

But is that likely? Having publicly and symbolically washed his hands of the responsibility of an innocent man's death would he then inscribe His execution with ultimate sarcasm?

And of course, to Christ's followers it was not a sarcasm – he was King at his birth and at his death.

Legacy

There are apocryphal accounts of Pilate turning to Christianity in later life. But In conclusion, the figure of Jesus Christ, the inscription "INRI," and the involvement of Pontius Pilate encapsulate the essence of Christian faith—a story of love, sacrifice, and the promise of redemption. The cross, with "INRI" atop it, stands as a timeless symbol of hope and salvation, inviting believers to reflect on the profound mystery of God's love made manifest in Christ.

BOSBURY ORGAN RESTORATION APPEAL NEWS

THE NEW BLOWER

The blower has now been fitted by Nicholsons organ builders. It has a new purpose built case and some beautifully hand crafted wooden trunking to connect it up. This new blower will supply enough air to enable the organist literally to "pull out all the stops" without danger of the instrument wheezing and sounding out of tune. It means that the pedal notes will sound as you have never heard them before! We are very grateful to all those who have donated and given concerts and recitals to make this possible.

The next stage of our plans is the re-leathering of the huge bellows. These are the original 150 year old bellows and the leather is unsurprisingly beginning to show signs of wear. As part of this stage we intend to restore the original hand pump which was in use until 1948 and still functions. It is a fascinating historical artefact and could probably even be used in case of a power cut!

The Garden in April



Now the spring equinox is behind us, I have really noticed how much lighter the evenings are more time to spend in our gardens and there is plenty to do!

If you have a propagator or warm windowsill, now is the time to sow summer bedding, and Cosmos, Marigolds (French & African), Zinnias, Asters etc. They should germinate well and need pricking out in a couple of weeks to grow on but don't plant out until the risk of frost has passed, perhaps as late as the end of May. Sow sweet peas outside where they will flower or in pots.

You will have noticed your perennials starting to grow away; give them a boost with some fertiliser around the base, e.g. Blood, Fish & Bone and then put in some sticks or other supports for all the extra growth. Perennials such as Penstemon or hardy Fuschia can also have their old growth well pruned back to make space for new shoots at the base. While you have the secateurs out, towards the end of the month prune back the old flower heads left on Hydrangeas as frost protection, to about 3-4 buds, no lower or you risk losing flowers.

Will this be a Sunflower year? Sow seeds into separate pots of compost in the greenhouse / propagator or windowsill until planting out in May. Giant varieties are fun for children, but the smaller multi-headed ones are a cheerful smile of colour in the border.

Although daffodils are over now, a high potash feed e.g. tomato food, will give better flowering next year.

An important job is to protect the new shoots of Hostas, Delphiniums, Lupins and other tempting new growth from slugs and snails. Last year's slug attack was a nightmare; the garlic wash was washed off by rain as soon as I sprayed it, wool pellets didn't work, or grit or eggshells. Beer traps caught a few; if we have frogs, they were overwhelmed. The only things that helped were copper tape on pots of Hosta as long as there were no overhanging plants/ bridges and circles of sheep's wool around Courgettes, Pumpkins, Beans etc. Let's hope this year is better!

In the Vegetable Garden


As the soil warms up we can really get going sowing vegetable seeds: Parsnips, Beetroot & Carrot, salad crops, Peas and Potatoes. Sow Radishes in any gaps for an extra crop.

Get ahead with pest control and pinch out tips of broad beans before they're covered in black fly or spray with soapy water.

Sow Tomatoes, Chillies and Courgettes in pots, to plant out in late May or June. I will plant some Runner and French beans in pots too, as germination outside is often variable, so I can fill in the gaps.

Have you ever grown Asparagus? Now is the time to plant them if you want to start. Preparation is key! Soil should be well drained, no weeds or large stones, well manured or plenty of compost, in an open, sunny position. For bare root stock, dig a good trench (8"deep x 12" wide). Set on a small hump in the bottom of the trench and 18" apart. Cover with 3-4" good soil and as the plant grows, fill in the trench. Water and keep weed free!

Don't harvest in the first year to let the crown establish; cut down in Autumn, mulch well, fertilise the next Spring and only cut a very few spears in this second year. The following year there should be plenty and the crown can last up to 20 years. Enjoy!


