## Thank You to One of Life's True Gentlemen

"I wonder how many people in Tarrington know how much they owe him?" said one of our friends when they heard of Andrew Mence's (our former church warden and treasurer's) death.

It was true in so many ways, from the sheer number of hours that he spent volunteering his time researching grants for the church, liaising with the Diocese and showing round various tradesmen to repair the fabric of the church, the hours attending local and Deanery meetings and setting up and watching over services.

Time that he and his beloved Alison would have loved to be spending in France... or with their precious family.

But Andrew was one of life's true statesman, incredibly kind, loyal, servant-hearted and honourable, such fun and a phenomenal source of fascinating history but one to brush off thanks and difficulties with a pickle grin and wry humour, not seeking the limelight.

But for all that apparent nonchalance, his wit hid his deeply caring heart. He had a capacity to see what others didn't:

He saw me when I moved up to Herefordshire knowing no-one and moved into Tarrington, on the edge, alone. His smile said Welcome, quietly taking the time to see that I was okay, checking in on me on Sundays and at meetings. I have always been grateful for that.

You might argue that that's what Christians do.....yes...

But how many people would also go into a cold church at 2am to 4am to pray for someone for several nights in a row?

Andrew did this for me in 2018. He heard that a 24hr prayer chain had been set up before my 16hr lifesaving operation and simply asked the prayer coordinator where were the gaps in the chain. "2am to 4am" he was told "everyone is in bed". "I will pray then" he said....and he did. The night before and the 2 nights following the surgery.

Yet I only found out by chance from one of the prayer coordinators....and, when I tried to thank him Andrew simply said "it's what you do" ....no, it's not what many people do; but Andrew wasn't many people.

He saw our Tim when he became a new church warden and began his ministry training course attached to Tarrington church, boosting his confidence by encouraging him and sharing his skills and knowledge with him.

He saw so many of us. Quietly. Kindly.

As I look up at the glorious happy photo of him on the back of his order of funeral service, raising his glass with his impish grin, I pray that we can see him and continue Andrew's legacy by seeing, welcoming and caring for one another in Tarrington and beyond.

Thank you Andrew.



# **BOSBURY ORGAN RESTORATION APPEAL NEWS**

### THE NEW BLOWER

The blower has now been fitted by Nicholsons organ builders. It has a new purpose built case and some beautifully hand crafted wooden trunking to connect it up. This new blower supplies enough air to enable the organist literally to "pull out all the stops" without danger of the instrument wheezing and sounding out of tune. It means that the pedal notes now sound as you have never heard them before! We are very grateful to all those who have donated and given concerts and recitals to make this possible.

The next stage of our plans is the re-leathering of the huge bellows. These are the original 150 year old bellows and the leather is unsurprisingly beginning to show signs of wear. As part of this stage we intend to restore the original hand pump which was in use until 1948 and still functions. It is a fascinating historical artefact and could probably even be used in case of a power cut!

# EDWARD LEAR

Edward Lear, author, illustrator, musician and poet endured lifelong health problems. From the age of six, he had frequent epileptic seizures, bronchitis, asthma and, during later life, partial blindness. Despite these disadvantages however he was able to travel widely and make his mark on the world through various mediums – notably the now lost art of nonsense verse.

Had he lived he would have been celebrating his 213<sup>th</sup> birthday on the 12<sup>th</sup> of this month – as it was he was taken from us after just 75 years, but not before he had gifted the world his most famous opus.

The Owl and The Pussy Cat – which now, being safely out of copyright and firmly in the public domain I set out below. Originally written for his friend's three year old daughter, Janet Symonds, and the cat therein is his own pet feline called Foss. Probably.

### Sunday MAY 18th at 9:45 for 10:30am

Café Church has become a special service, where we sit around the café tables rather than in the pews. If a formal church service isn't for you this might be the answer. There is time and space to relax and ponder, to share our news and our concerns, to pray for the world and our own community.

All of the family are welcome, there are toys and plenty of space for the kids.

There will be coffee, tea, croissants etc. from 9:45.

We'll be sharing a reading, talking about faith in today's world, singing some songs, saying some prayers.



Well what a difference from last year! Instead of weeks of rain, as I write in mid-April, we have had weeks of sunshine; already I have got my watering can out for the pots. Interestingly, the parts of my vegetable garden where I am trialling a no-dig method with a layer of cardboard and a good layer of compost mulch, are much less dry, with more worm activity and were much less effort to prepare than traditional digging.

**In the Flower garden**, early flowering shrubs, like forsythia, have been glorious this Spring but need pruning quite hard to encourage new young growth for flowering next year. Daffodils and primroses have also flourished, but May is a good time to divide overcrowded clumps to thrive better next year. Giving a liquid feed to Spring bulbs generally will help future flowering.

The Peonies and other perennial flowers have been shooting up since April and need supporting before they get too tall and flop. You can buy stylish metal hoops but sturdy twigs or sticks with a bit of homemade willow weaving will do equally well. As new growth speeds up, keep an eye open for aphids, especially on roses, and wipe off or spray with soft soap before they take hold.

May is the month for planting up hanging baskets and containers with bedding plants, using a good compost and some slow release fertiliser. Acclimatise them gradually by putting them out in good weather and taking in at night. Similarly harden off summer bedding before planting out into the garden towards the end of the month – if you haven't got any, there is still time to sow Hardy Annuals direct outside, such as Sunflowers, Calendula, Nasturtiums, Cornflower, for a blast of colour in the Summer. Plant out dahlia and cannas after all risk of frost has passed, which can be well into May.

**In the Vegetable garden**, the Strawberry plants are full of flower; cutting off the runners will help the plants to put all their energy into fruit. I will be giving them a boost with a high Potash feed and then working straw around each plant to protect from soil splashes when it rains and to deter slugs.

Runner and French Beans, Sweet corn and Courgettes can now be sown; starting them off in small pots in the greenhouse or window sill and transplanting later as strong plants, seems to work better than direct into the ground, where they get eaten off as soon as they come through. Keep sowing lettuce, beetroot, carrots and peas for picking through the summer, and earth up potatoes as soon as they come through.

**Focus on Herbs** – **Thyme**: There are many varieties, green, golden or variegated, plain or lemon flavoured with white through to purple flowers much favoured by bees. They vary from tiny prostrate varieties, to 30cm high, but are not long lived and need replacing every 3-4 years. New plants can be bought ready to go, or grown from cuttings, layers or seeds taken or sown in spring, though plants from seed may not be ready to harvest for up to a year. Thyme grows best in a sunny spot in light, free draining soil; if yours is heavy and cold, try growing in a pot with a light gritty compost. Water to establish, but then plants are quite drought tolerant. Trim back once a year to maintain shape, but avoid cutting into old wood.

Thyme tastes good in stews, with roast meat, fish or chicken and in pasta sauce and herby breads. Enjoy!







## **A LETTER FROM LINDE**

Dear Friends,

"May is the month of expectation, the month of wishes, the month of hope." So wrote the poet and novelist Emily Brontë.

But May also holds the tradition of dedicating the month of May to Mary, which started in the 13th century, possibly to replace various pagan cults. Spring is, of course, celebrated with nature renewing itself - as Mary gave new life & hope to the world with giving birth to Jesus. However, the real reason is that May is the time when spring is traditionally at the height of its beauty. As we drive past our beautiful old Herefordshire orchards, the sight and smell of apple blossom is a feast for the senses and a balm for the soul.

The poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, in observing burgeoning new life in the spring, writes in 'The May Magnificat:'

'All things rising, all things sizing Mary sees, sympathising With that world of good, Nature's motherhood...'





For 36 years, Music in Country Churches has been organising concerts of exceptional music in rural churches in England and Wales.
